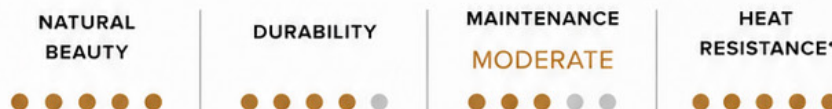


NATURAL STONE

CARE + MAINTENANCE

Natural stone is a timeless material formed by nature. With proper care and routine maintenance, your stone surfaces will retain their beauty and performance for years.

AT A GLANCE



*Use trivets or heat mats under hot items to prevent thermal shock and potential damage.

DAILY CARE

- Wipe surfaces regularly with a soft, damp cloth to remove dust, dirt, and spills.
- Use warm water with a few drops of mild, pH-neutral soap.
- Rinse thoroughly and dry with a soft cloth to prevent water spots.
- Clean spills promptly to prevent staining.

Avoid acidic, abrasive, or harsh chemical cleaners.

PERIODIC MAINTENANCE

- Use a stone-specific cleaner for deeper cleaning when needed.
- For porous stones, apply a high-quality stone sealer as recommended by the manufacturer.
- Reseal as directed—frequency depends on stone type, finish, and use.
- Use coasters, trivets, and placemats to protect the surface from moisture and heat.

Regular care preserves the stone's natural beauty and longevity.
