Manufactured quartz surfaces are engineered for durability, beauty, and ease of maintenance—perfect for hospitality environments. With a simple care routine, your quartz surfaces will maintain their exceptional appearance for years to come.

AT A GLANCE



DAILY + ROUTINE CARE

- Wipe surfaces daily with a soft microfiber cloth or sponge to remove dust, oils, and residue.
- Clean with warm water and a few drops of mild dish soap or neutral cleaner.
- Rinse thoroughly with clean water to remove all soap residue.
- Dry with a soft cloth to prevent water spots or streaks.

Avoid using abrasive cleaners or pads that can dull the finish.

SPILLS + STUBBORN RESIDUE

- **Act fast**—blot spills immediately (coffee, wine, juice, ink, cosmetics, etc.). Quartz is stain-resistant, but standing liquids can eventually affect the resin.
- **Dried spills:** Reconstitute the spill with water for several minutes, then clean with a damp cloth.
- For stubborn spots, use 70% isopropyl alcohol or a non-abrasive stone cleaner. Apply to a soft cloth and wipe gently. Rinse thoroughly.
- **Never use abrasive pads;** they can damage the finish/sheen.

WHAT TO AVOID

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Harsh chemicals or solvents (bleach, oven cleaners, paint strippers, drain cleaners, etc.) can permanently damage or discolor the surface.• Abrasive pads or tools (steel wool, stiff brushes, scouring pads).• Prolonged exposure to any cleaning solution. | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• No sealing required. Quartz is non-porous and does not absorb sealers.• Direct heat from cookware or appliances. Always use trivets or heat mats.• Heavy impact or dropping of hard objects. |
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NO SEALING REQUIRED

Manufactured quartz is a dense, non-porous engineered surface—sealers are not needed and should not be used.
